



Easy Target

In 2012, over 500 incidents of thefts from vehicles were reported in St. Mary's County. The vast majority of the vehicles entered had been left unlocked by the victims and valuables often in plain view were stolen. These items included currency, purses, and expensive electronic items such as GPS, radar detectors, and MP3 players.

We ask everyone to do their part in helping prevent these crimes.

Be aware of your surroundings and report any suspicious activity such as unfamiliar persons and/or vehicles in the area. If possible, note as much descriptive information as possible of the person or vehicle. License plate numbers are extremely helpful.

Certain crime patterns are detected throughout St. Mary's County. These crimes include:

- Burglaries to Sheds, Garages, and Residences and;
- Thefts of Currency, Purses and Electronic Equipment from Vehicles

We encourage citizens to adopt a crime prevention mindset and use precautions to protect property & ensure safety.

- ✓ Lock all residence and vehicle doors and windows. Keep valuables out of view, both in vehicles and residential windows.
- ✓ If you find your residence has been broken into, DO NOT enter the residence; immediately call 9-1-1 and wait for police arrival.
- ✓ Report suspicious activity, persons and vehicles; provide a description of the person(s) and/or vehicle including a tag number.
- ✓ Outside doors to residence & outbuildings should be made of solid wood or metal and have deadbolt locks.
- ✓ Secure sliding glass doors with commercially available locks or with a broomstick/wooden dowel in the track to help prevent the door from being pried open.
- ✓ Secure double-hung windows by sliding a bolt or nail through a hole drilled at a downward angle in each top corner of the inside sash and part way through the outside sash. Lock basement windows!
- ✓ Light property at night; use timers which automatically turn on outside lights at dark. Consider motion sensors that set off lights or alarms.
- ✓ Record serial numbers of power equipment, i.e. dirt bike, pressure washer, riding lawn mower, power tools, electronic equipment, etc and bicycles.
- ✓ Cut back shrubbery that hides doors, windows, and lights.
- ✓ Warn thieves you're on the alert with "No Trespassing" and other signs around your property.
- ✓ Lookout for your neighbor.
